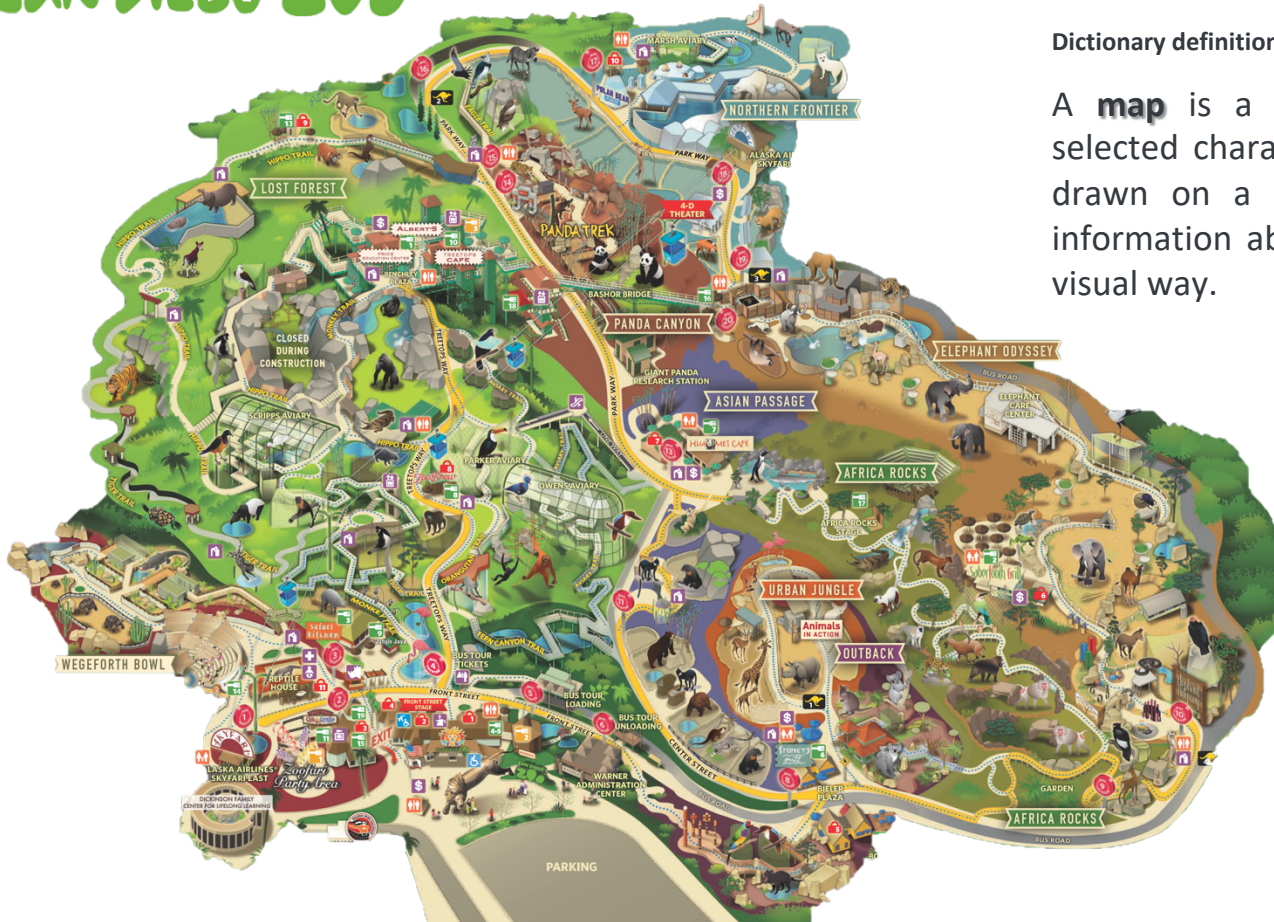

Process landscape - The Foundation for process analysis

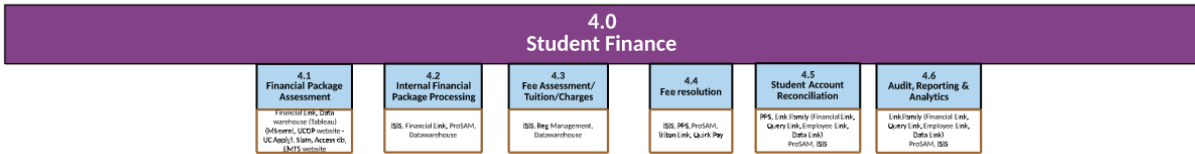
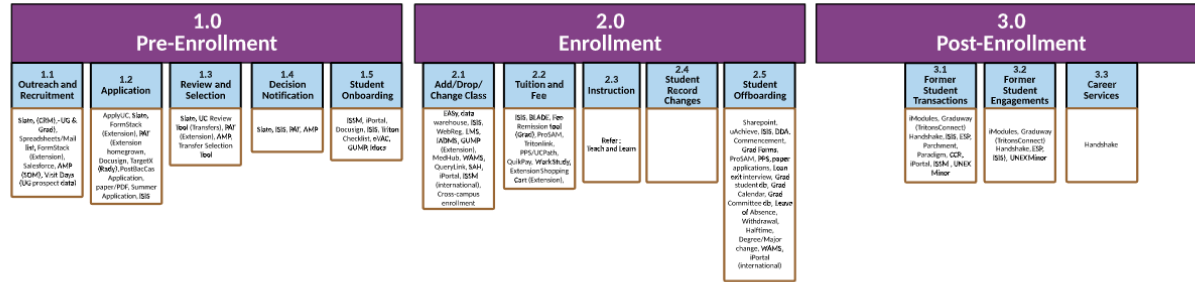

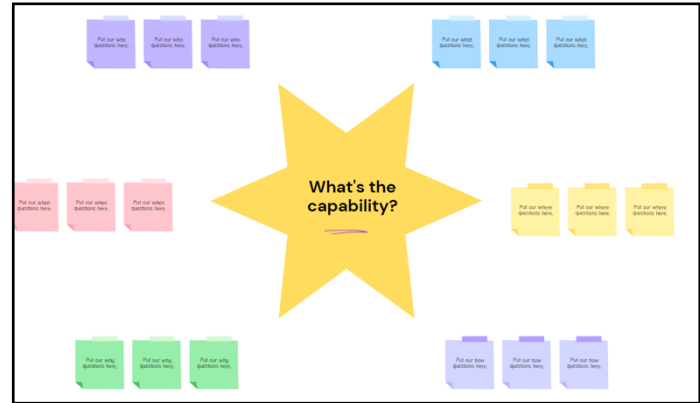
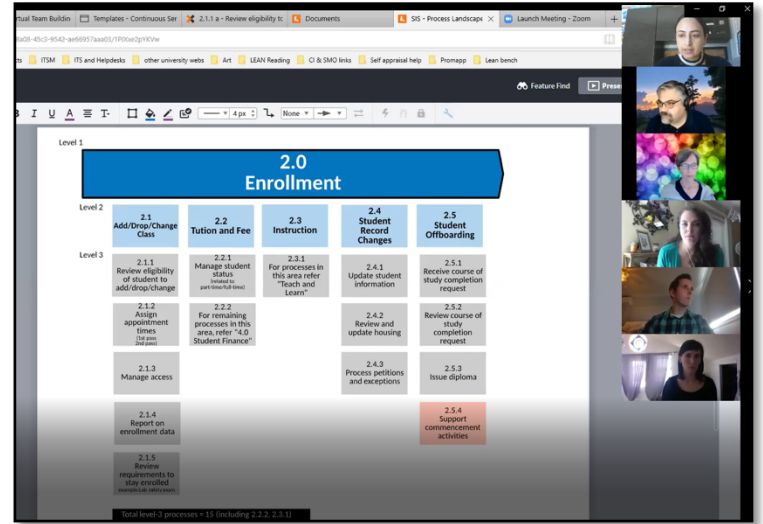
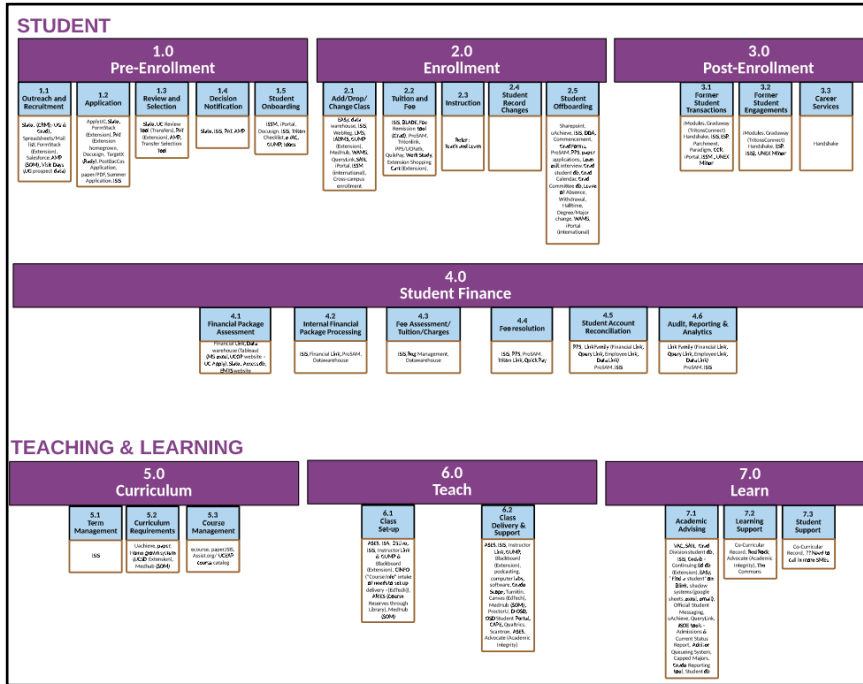


Process Landscape is a tool for communicating information about the business processes across a large business area to stakeholders, in a visual, more easily digestible way.

As a process landscape facilitator, your job is

- To be curious. To engage your stakeholders.
- To consolidate process clusters.
- Enrich the content by bringing out different perspectives
- Do not over complicate things, bring the focus back on creating simple one page view of what the business does.

There is a time and place for going
down rabbit holes.
Process landscape is not it.

Process Evaluation

Process Evaluation could lead to identification of the process into one of the FOUR categories:

#	Category	Why does the process belong to this category ?
1.	Process needs improvements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Process needs to be simplified/made more lean by reducing waste▪ Need to build standardization (by reducing variation in how the process is handled across departments)
2.	Current state	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ After due consideration, decision has been made to carry forward the current process in the new system (with possibility of reviewing at a later time)
3.	Out of scope	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Process will be handled outside of the new system
4.	Retire	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Process will be retired or replaced
